

To the Board of the Crockett Fund:

The Enfield Shaker Museum was founded in 1986. The Museum is a 501(c) 3 which focuses on the goals of educating the public on the Enfield, New Hampshire Shaker Village and preserving the site for future generations. On behalf of the Enfield Shaker Museum, I would like to request the sum of \$2,400.00 dollars which will allow us to create two new exhibits on the agricultural legacy of the United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing better known as the Shakers.

The first of these exhibits will be a four-panel portable set-up located on the inside drive of the 1854 Cow Barn. This building, while open to visitors during our season, is used for storage during the off-season. Therefore, a portable display will allow us to safely remove and store the panels during the winter. The emphasis of the barn exhibit will be on both Shaker agricultural practices and the architectural forms used to facilitate these processes. An additional theme of this exhibit will be to explain the significance of the 1854 Cow Barn as one of the few remaining examples of a Shaker Great Barn.

A second fixed exhibit of four panels will emphasize the relationship between the farm and the work carried out by the Shaker Sisters. The panels will also discuss how the Brothers and Sisters worked together to accomplish various tasks. This exhibit will be in our Dairy building in a space where we have displayed an assortment of Shaker dairy equipment through the years. This location is unique, because it still bears the signs of this important industry including whey stains on the walls from the many years of dairy production.

The requested funds are based on the following associated costs including the cost of color printing eight foam core panels, funds for additional research time, administrative costs and any amounts associated with publishing images that are not part of the collection of the Enfield Shaker Museum.
